

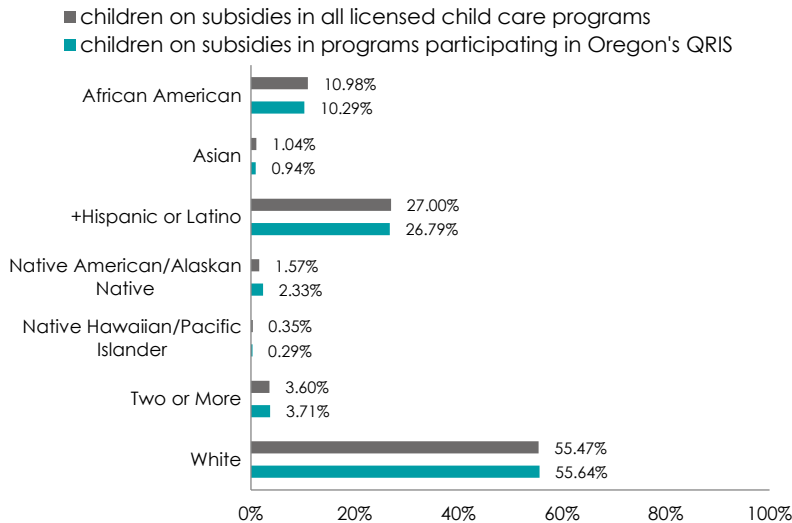


Children Receiving Subsidies in Oregon

For reporting period: January 1, 2019 to March 31, 2019

An important goal of Oregon's Early Learning System is to increase access to high quality care and education for all children in Oregon. This includes children from low income families and across all racial and ethnic backgrounds. The following information depicts data about children receiving child care subsidies and is the only available data about children in child care.

Children in Subsidized Care

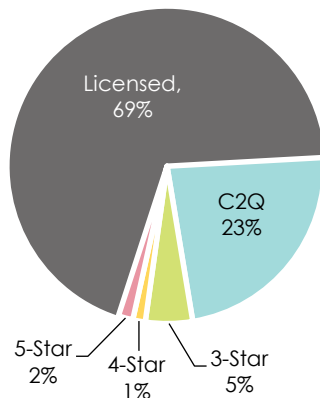


Subsidies in Oregon

Current data shows that children from low income families are accessing quality child care and that those children are from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds. 31% of children receiving subsidies are in licensed QRIS participating programs (Commitment to Quality (C2Q) to 5-Star). 44% of those are from racial and/or ethnic groups, which are considered minorities, as compared to the percentage of minorities in subsidy across all licensed programs (45%).

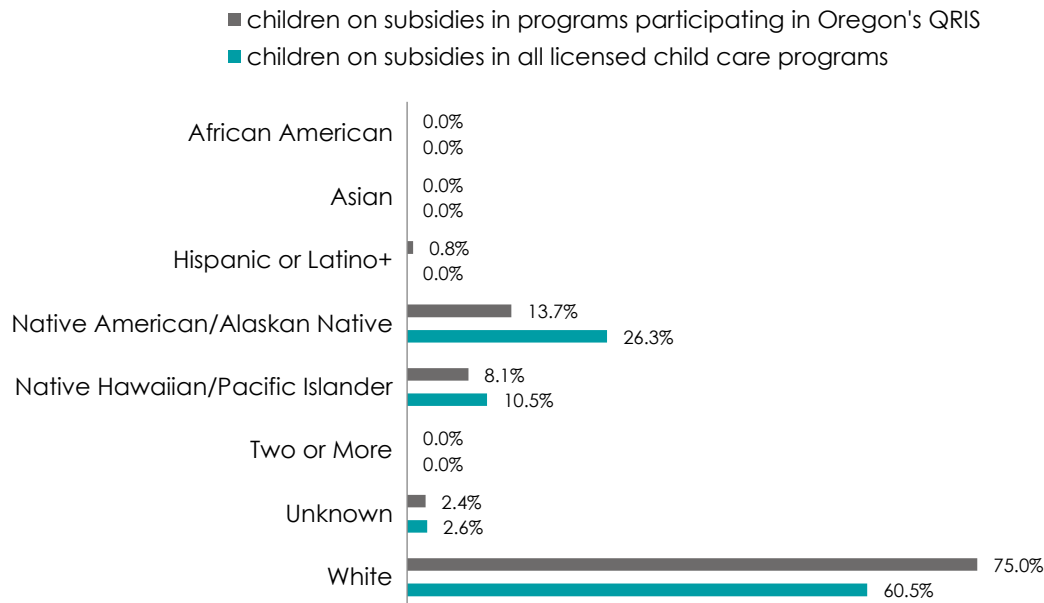

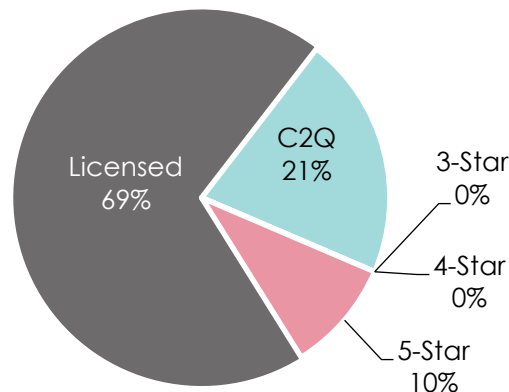

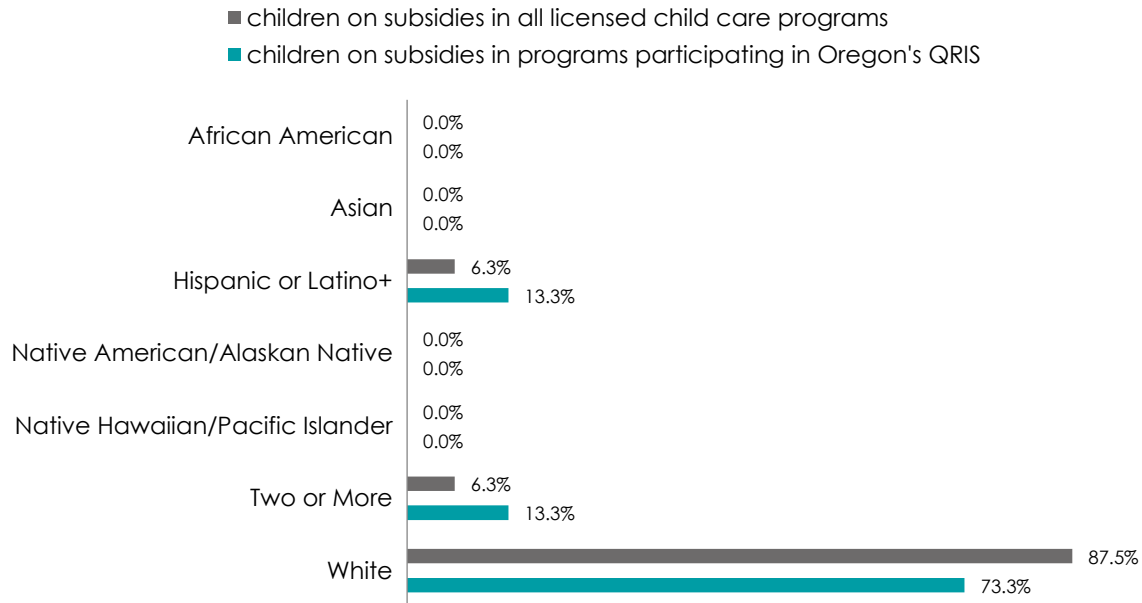

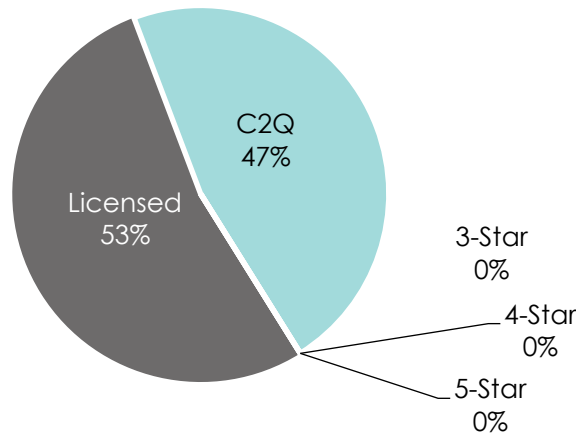

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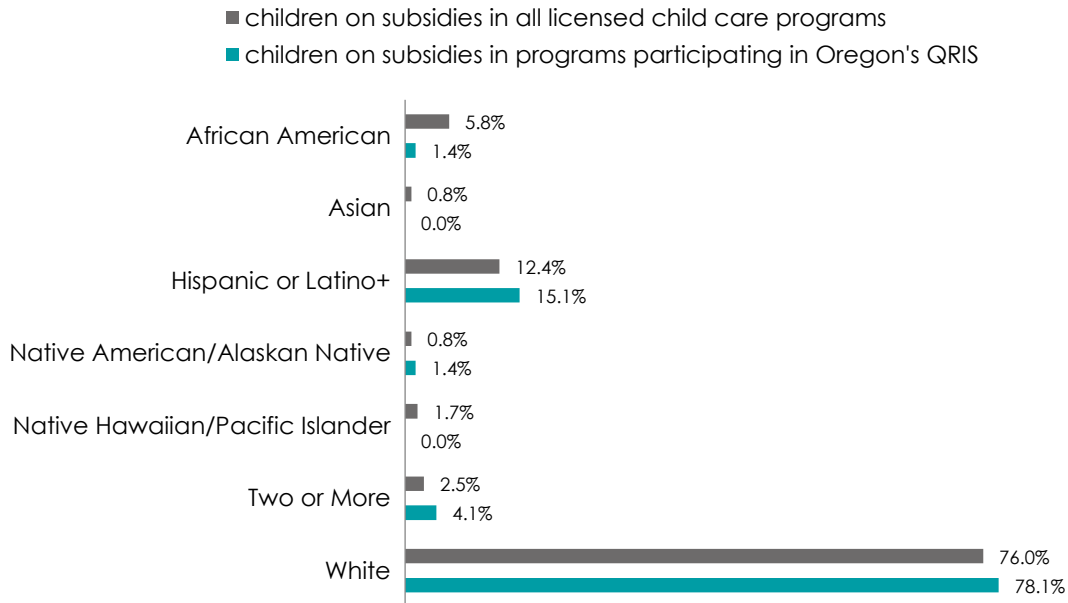

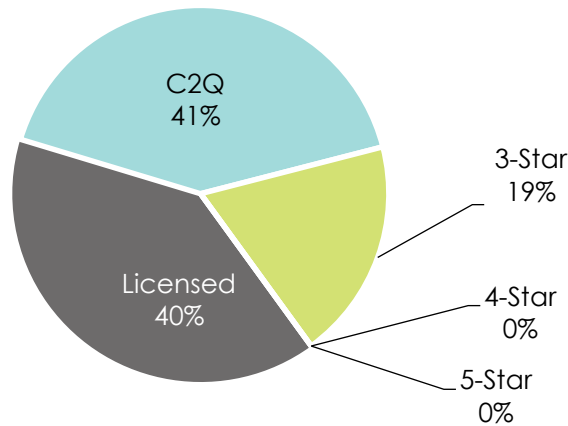

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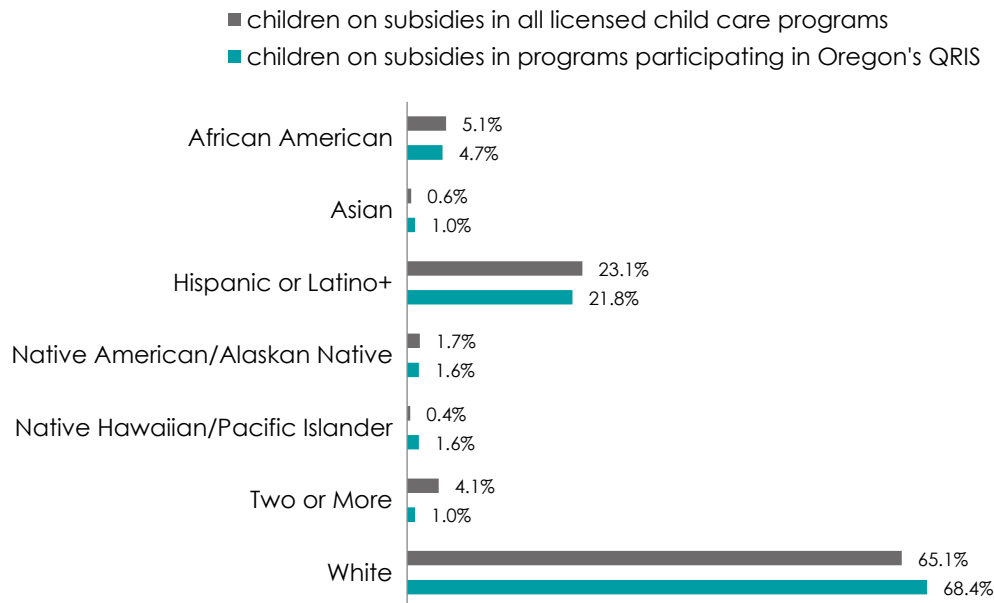

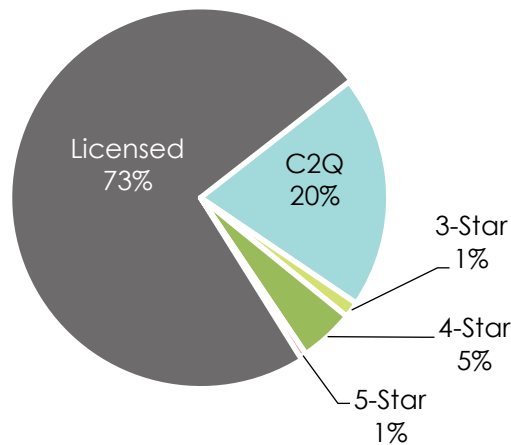

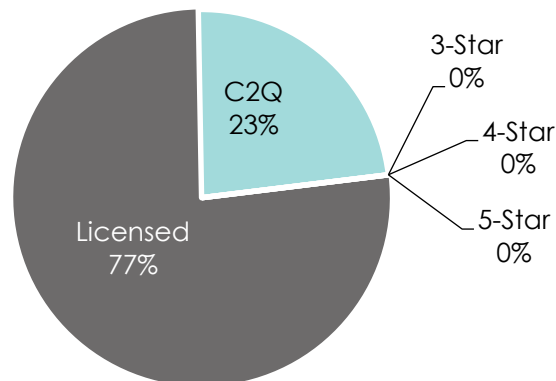

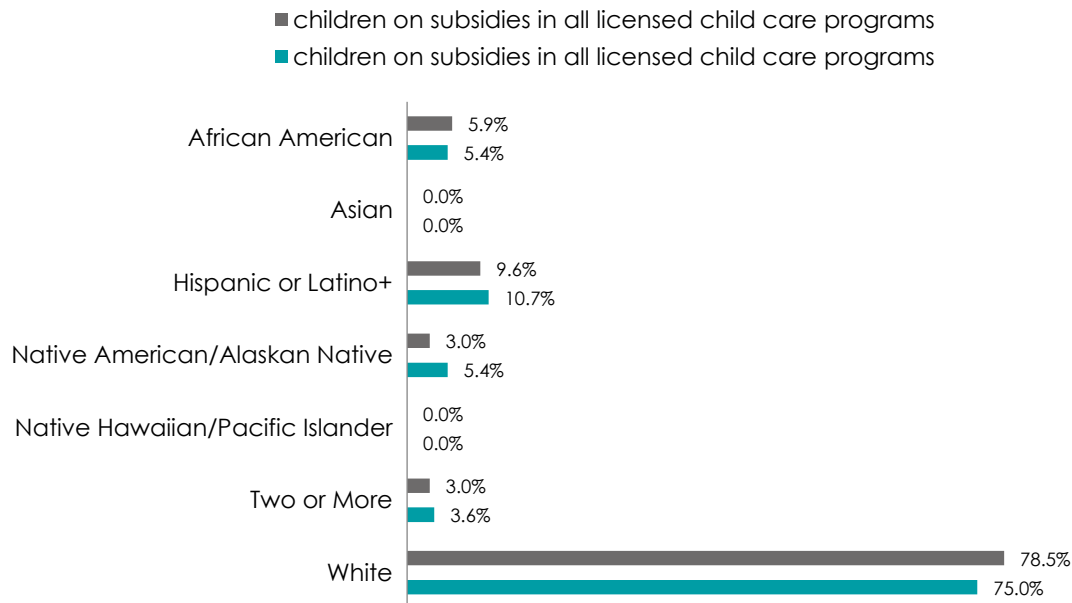

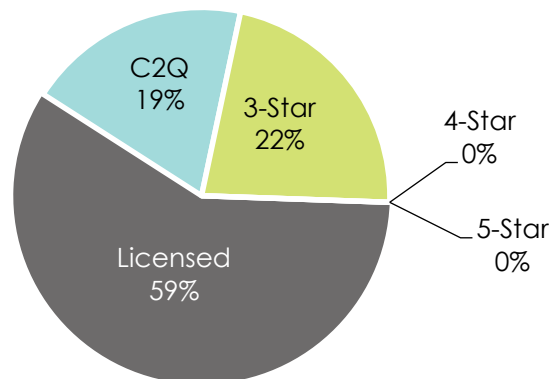

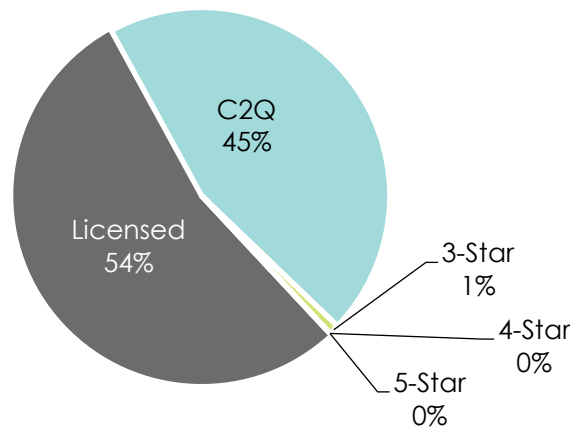

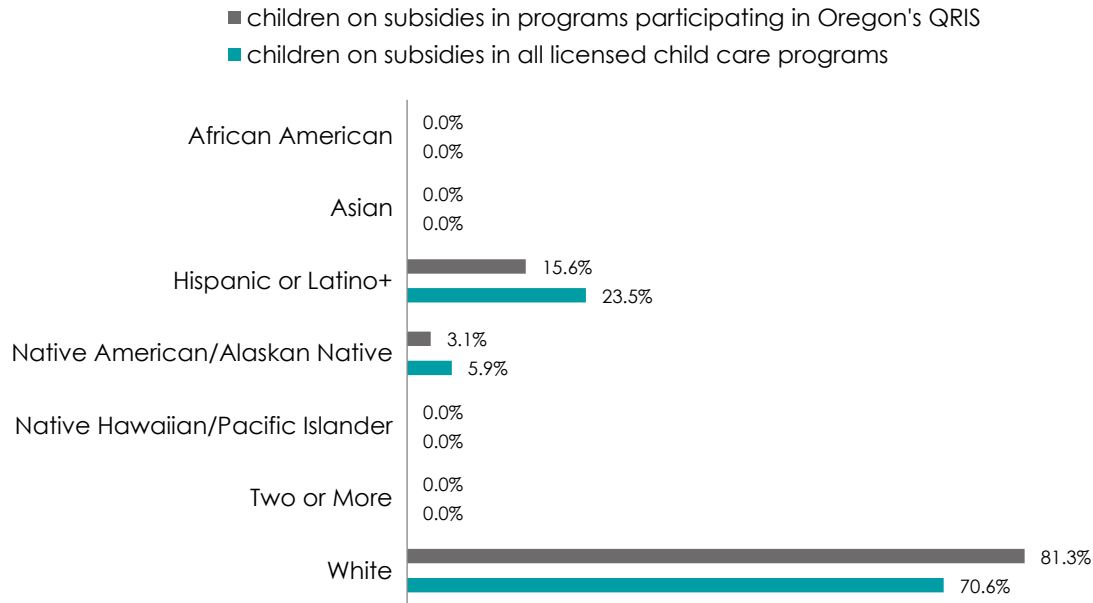

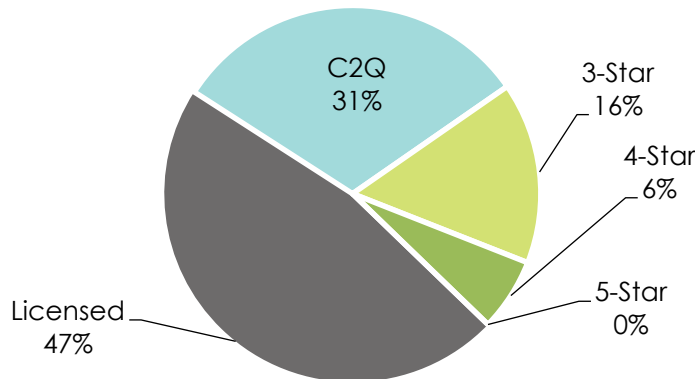

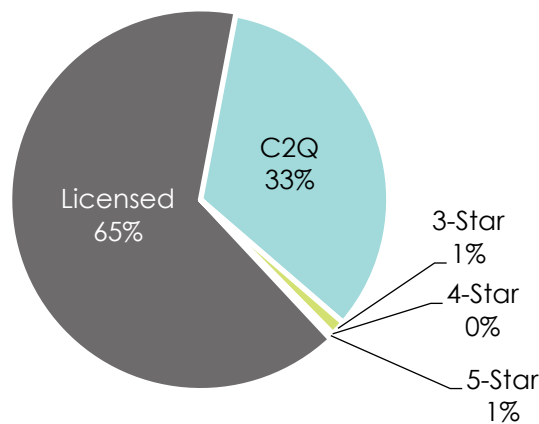

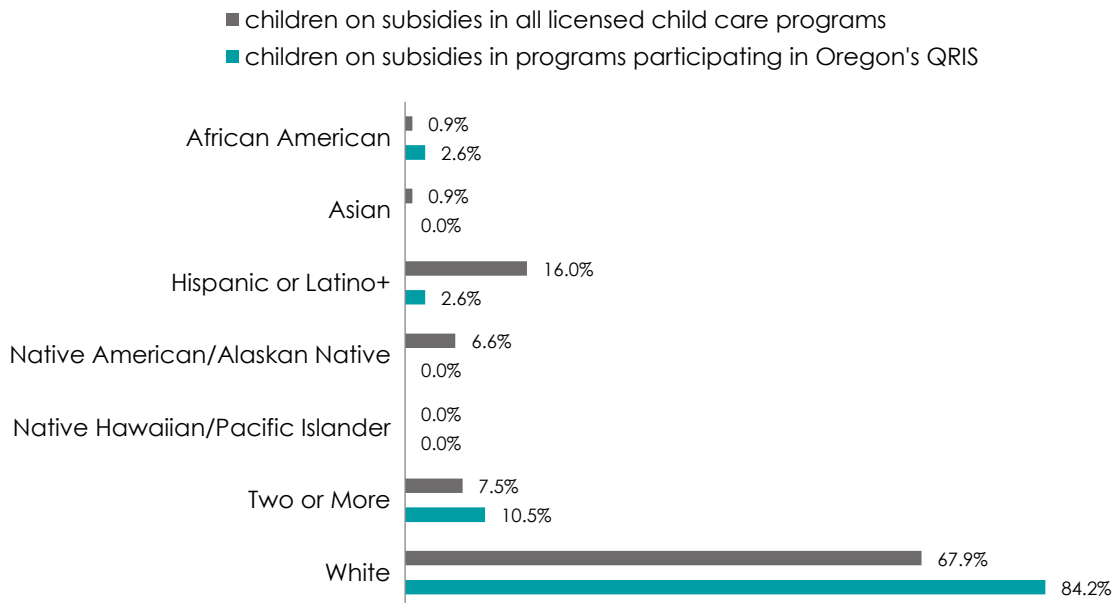

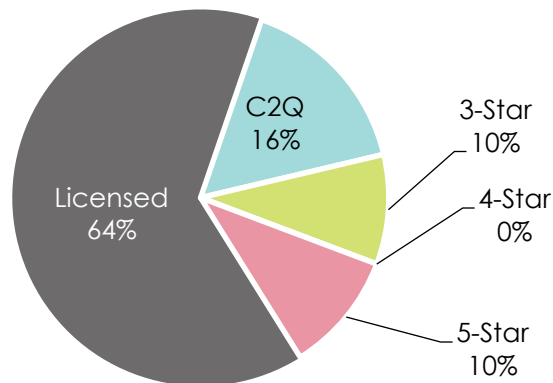

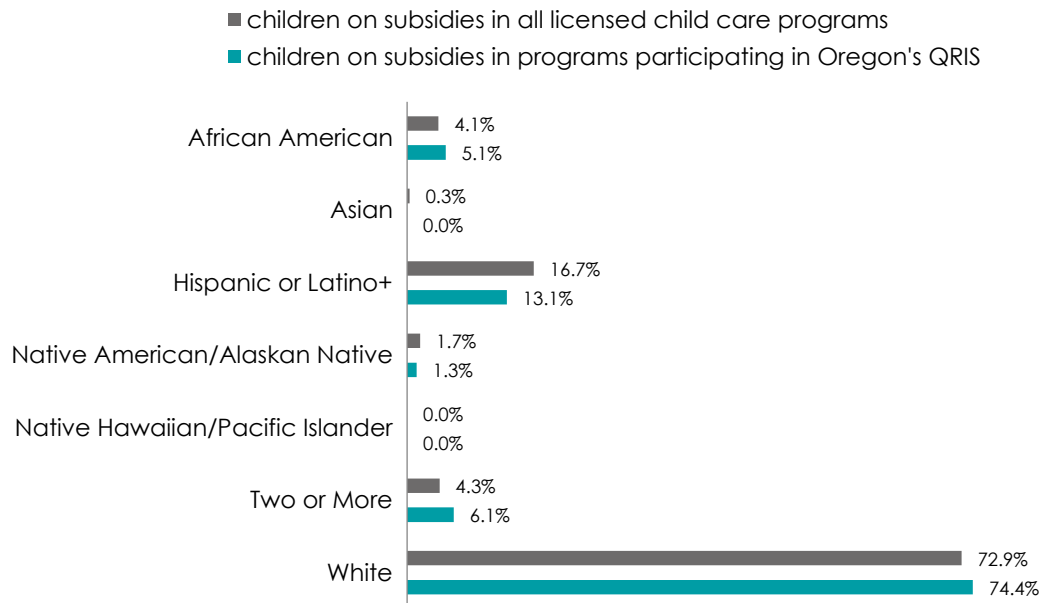

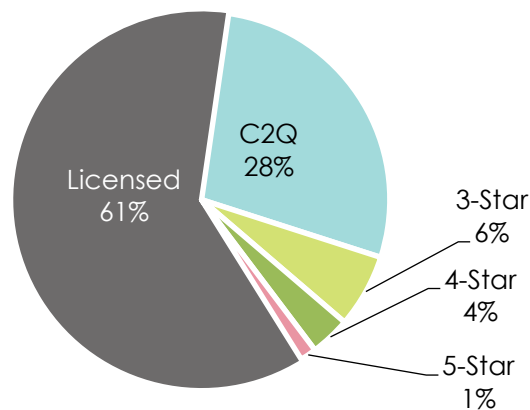

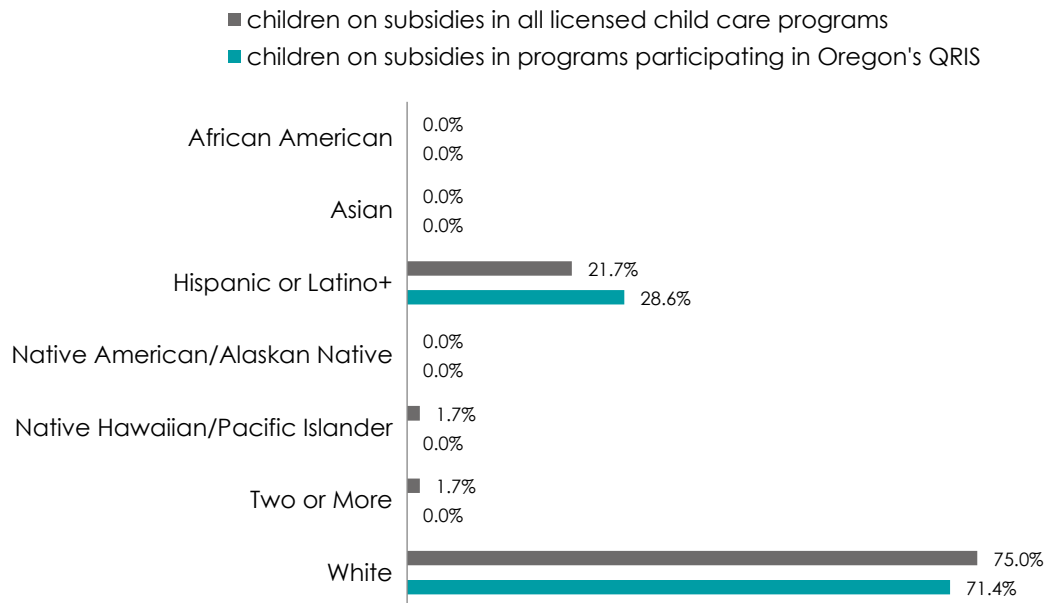

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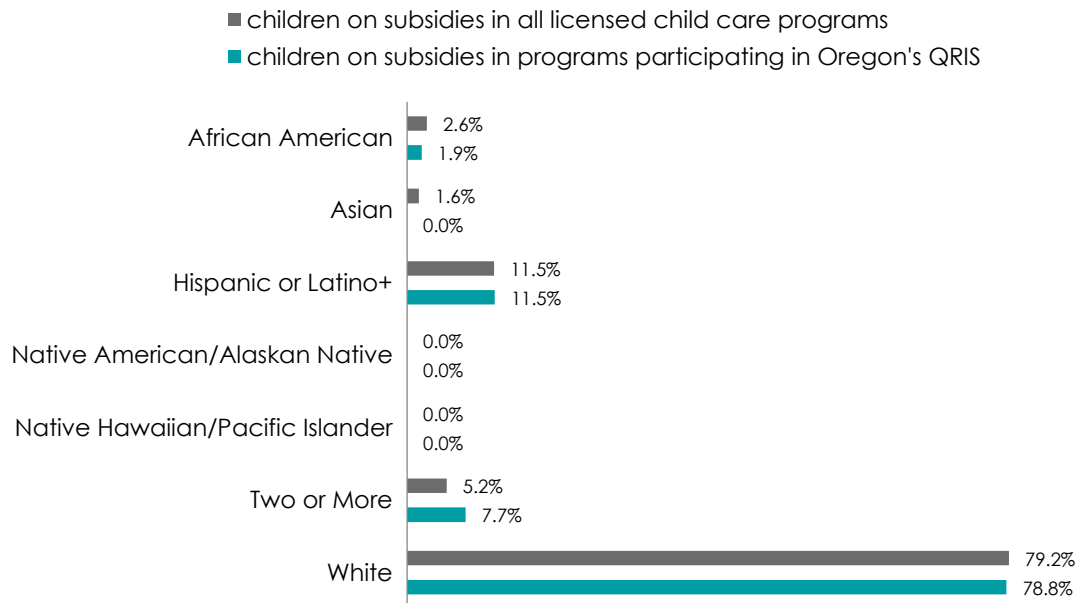

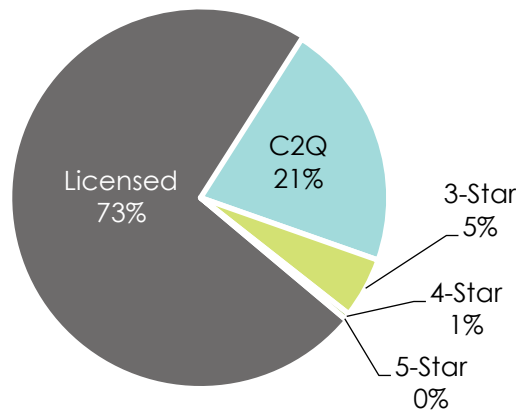

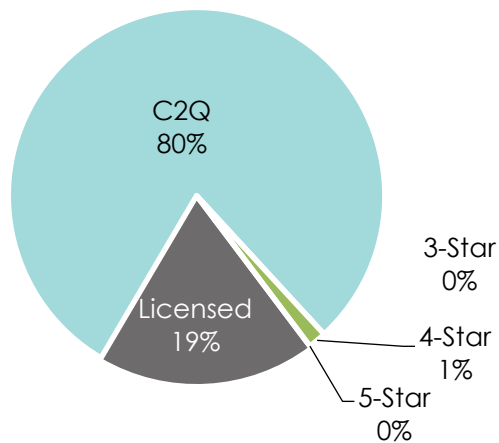

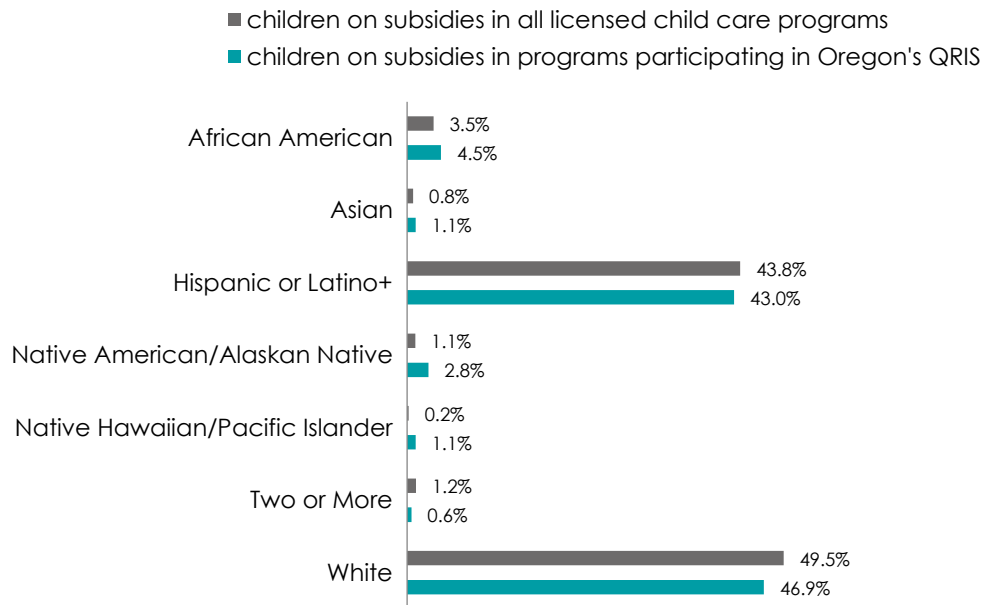

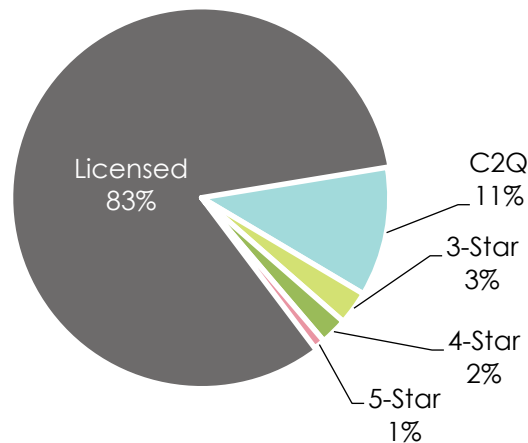

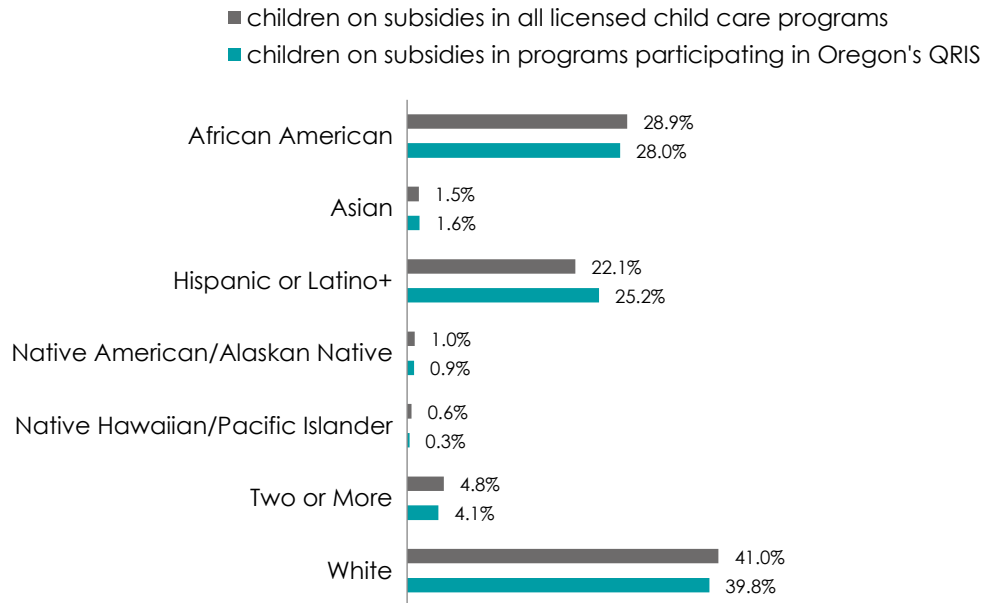


Children & Families Receiving Child Care Subsidies in Multnomah County

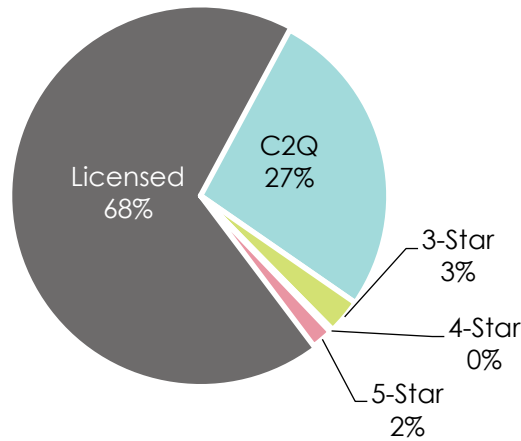
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Children on Subsidies by Demographic Information

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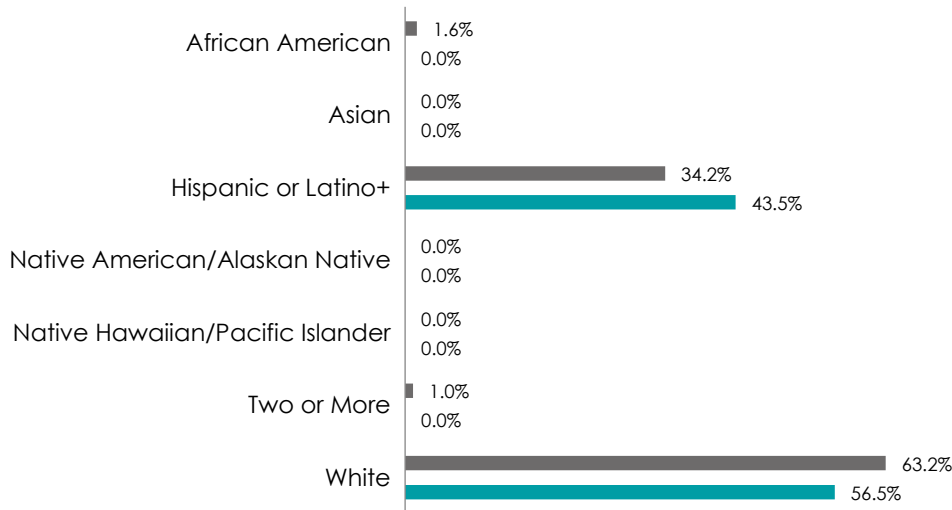

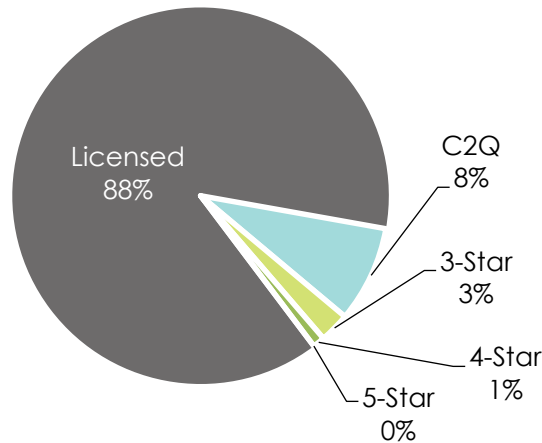

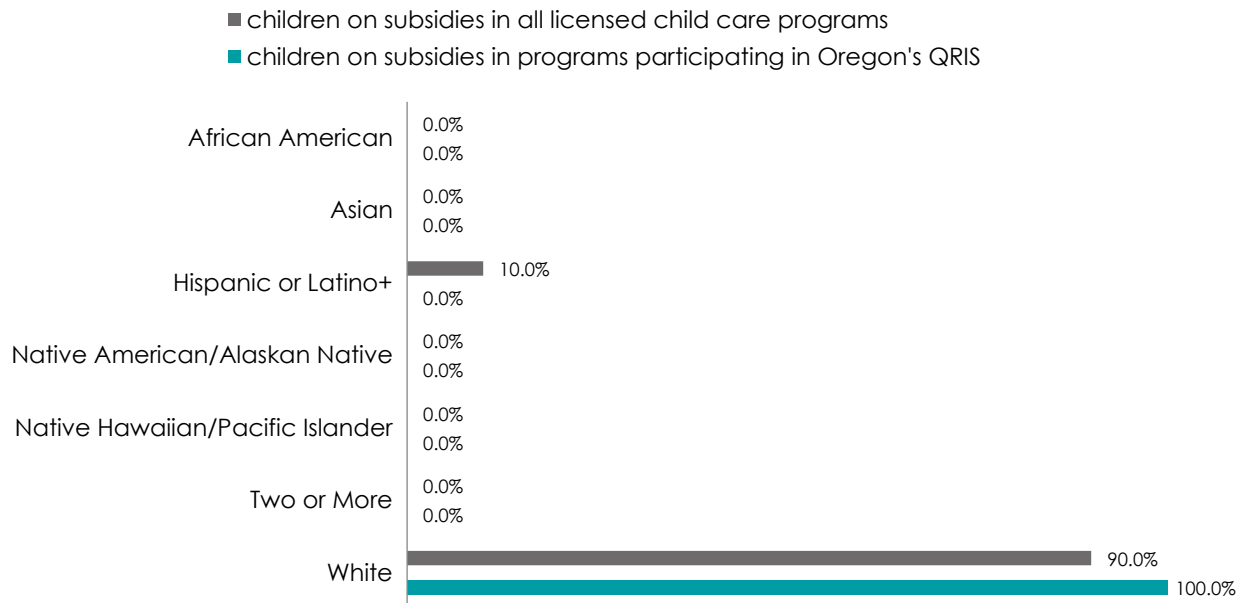


Children & Families Receiving Child Care Subsidies in Tillamook County

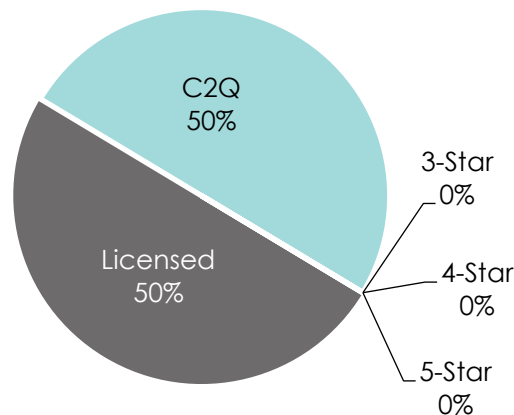
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Children on Subsidies by Demographic Information

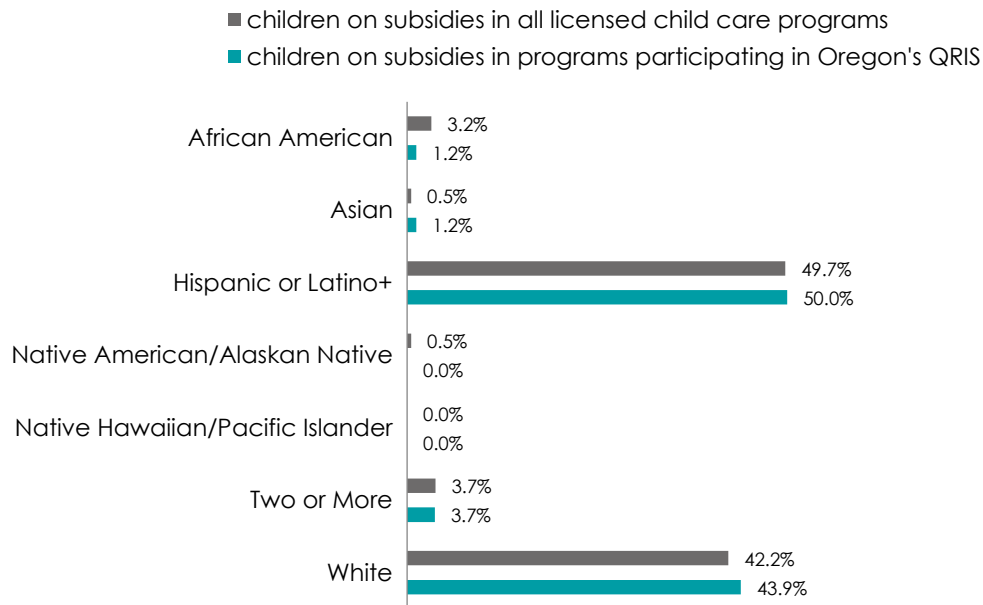


Children & Families Receiving Child Care Subsidies in Umatilla County

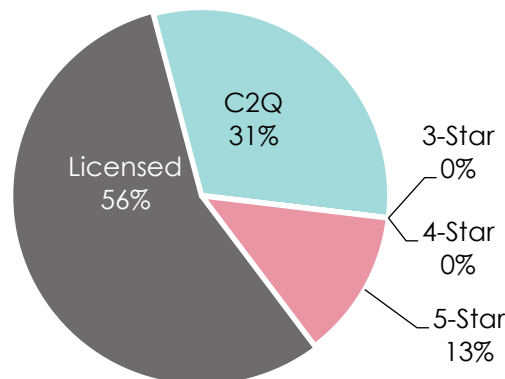
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Children on Subsidies by Demographic Information

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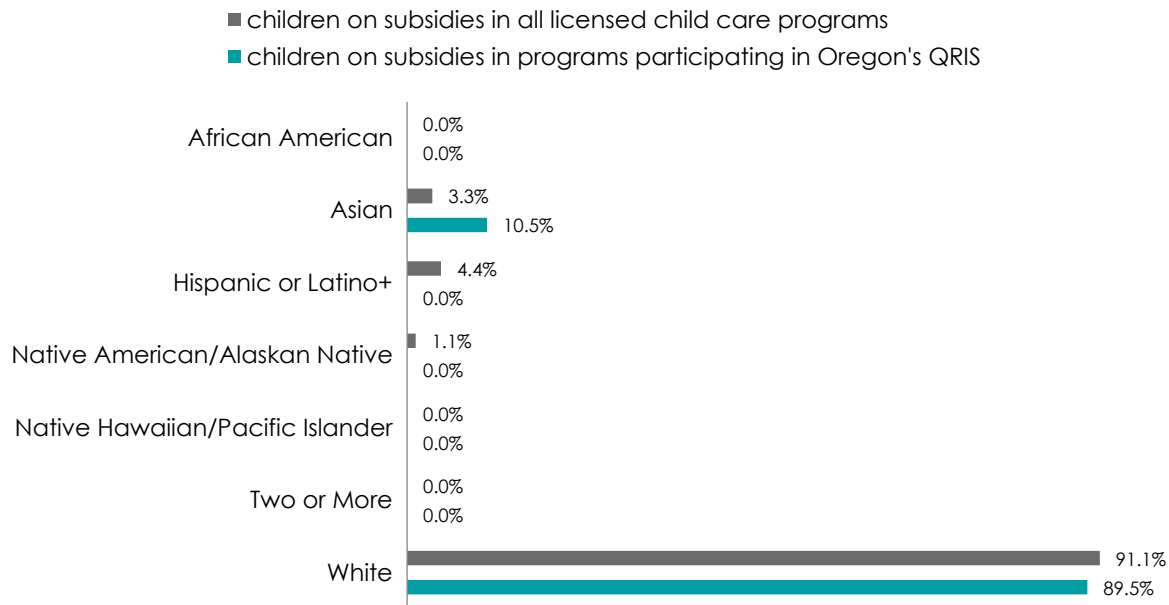


Children & Families Receiving Child Care Subsidies in Union County

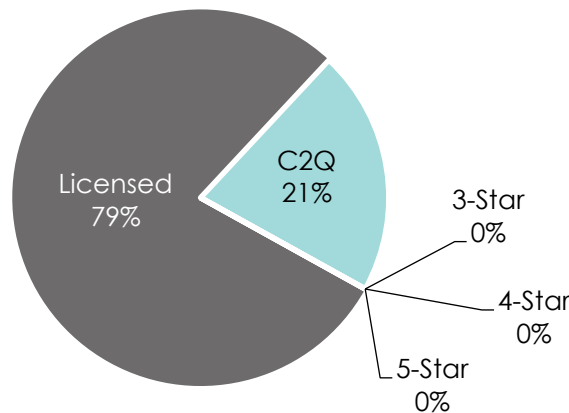

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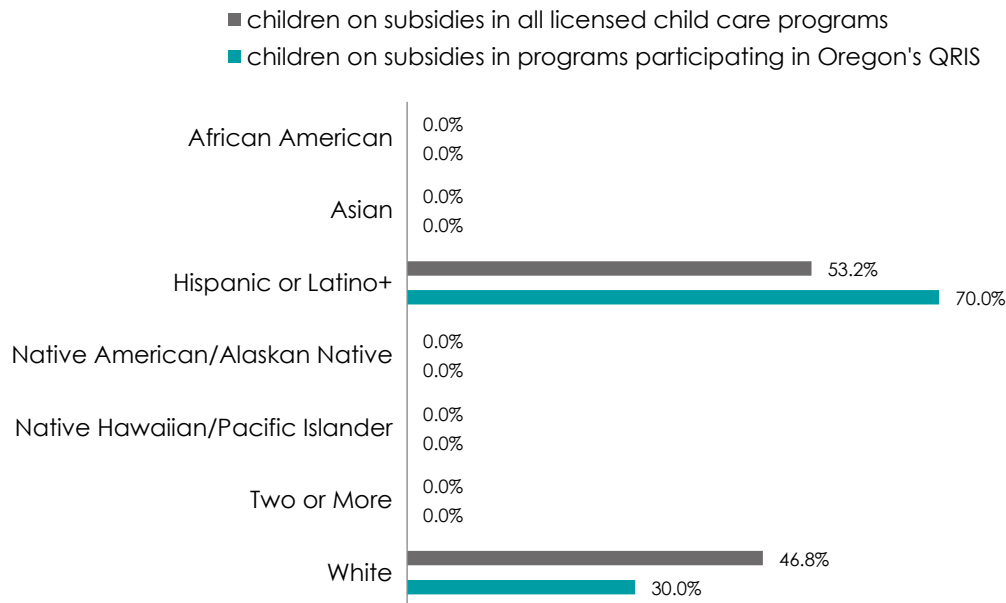


Children & Families Receiving Child Care Subsidies in Wasco County

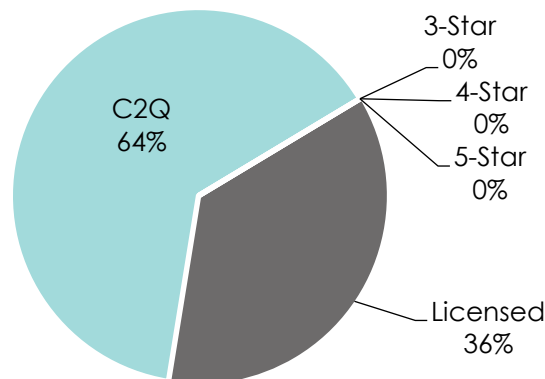
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Children on Subsidies by Demographic Information

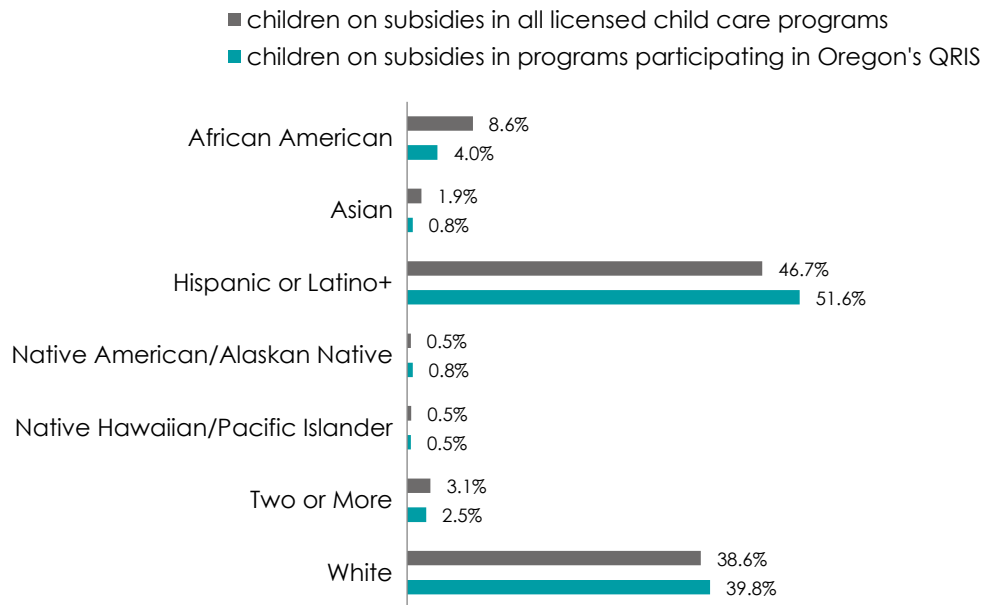

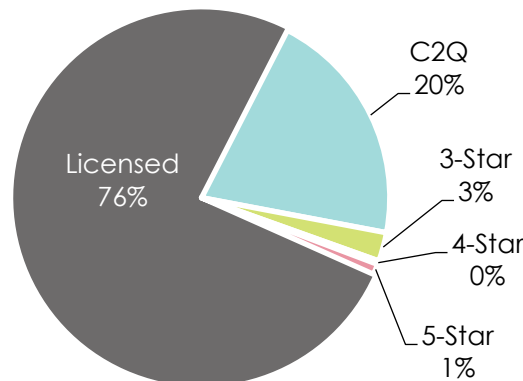

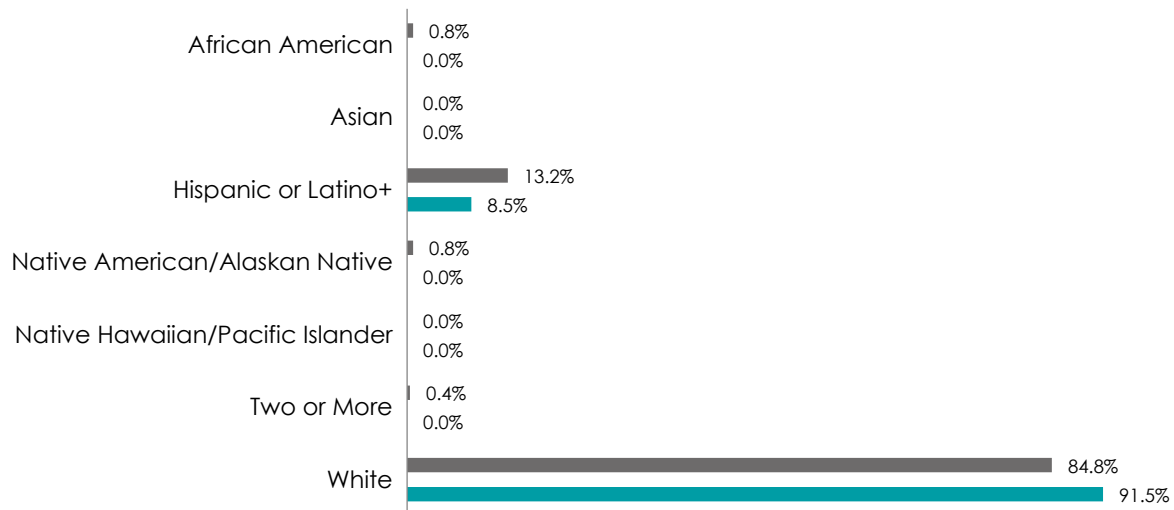

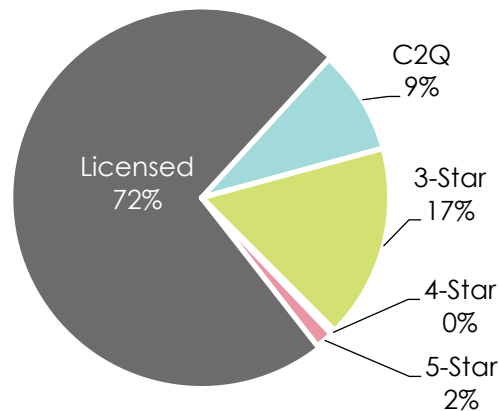
